From the Pastor

When I entered into seminary, one of my passions was youth and family ministry. That was one of my focuses, but God had a greater calling for my life. A passion I hold is to develop a more intentional ministry that focuses on the family, which is the glorious Church of Jesus Christ. My passion is centered on how we can continue to build on developing the relationship of

parents with children as well as to continue to bridge the generational divide that has seemed to have grown so wide within the walls of our churches.

In my time in ministry, I have not been a great supporter of the Children's Church model that grew in popularity over the late eighties and nineties. Families are meant to worship together.



But when Jesus saw it, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands on them.

Mark 10:14-16, ESV

Cry rooms are beneficial to help parents comfort a child that is upset, but I don't believe that they should remain there throughout a service. The greatest challenge that we find in the Church is that people don't necessarily feel safe. Children will learn how to worship as they worship. A regular church service is weird to a child. especially when we

compare it to the shows and things that a child would normally watch and participate in within their normal day-to-day. As we sit with our children, we can open up the wonder of our faith and what it means for Jesus Christ to be our Lord and Savior.

As a father, I have navigated this and continue to navigate it imperfectly.

Some things we did for a season, and some have become patterns for our regular daily life.

My wife and I continually to try things to add in from time-to-time also. My great joy is watching my children take charge of our regular times for prayer and wanting to have opportunities to lead. It is something that they look forward to, and that is where I find it to be most vital that we establish patterns in our children's lives with the hope that they will carry them on in their lives for generations.

I envision creating an atmosphere in our congregation that will foster this interaction within all our families and bring together the generations that worship with one another—returning to what was once the norm in all Christian congregations. Currently, we see gaps in our church where we can see generations very lowly represented, but there is still hope as we faithfully speak the Word of God. We reach out to the community and highlight the benefit of faith in the home. We are returning to our children the wonder within Scripture as they come to know the love of their Father in Heaven and the gift of Christ given to us all upon the Cross.

ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN



Relief for Human Need Worldwide

St. John's Lutheran (The Clock Church) will once again be collecting items for Orphan Grain Train. Orphan Grain Train is a Christian volunteer network that ships donated food, clothing, medical and other needed items to people in 69 different countries including the USA.

If your church or organization wishes to donate any items, they can be dropped off at the church anytime the church is open, either on Sunday morning or during office hours (Monday-Thursday from 9a-4p). We will be accepting items until Packing Day, which is Saturday, August 19. If your church or organization donates a large amount of items, it would be very helpful if you could pack your items by category and label the boxes. Would you also please consider sending some volunteers to help us on packing day? Lunch will be served if packing goes past Noon.

Items needed:

Infant: clothes, cloth and disposable diapers, stuffed toys, baby wipes, sleepers, onesie, receiving blankets, blankets, new pacifiers & bottles.

Medical Equipment and Supplies: bandages & tapes, bed & bath linens, sheets (adult and crib sizes), disposable gowns and gloves, hospital beds (hand-crank with vinyl mattresses, prosthetic limbs, walkers, wheelchairs, crutches & canes, stethoscopes, blood pressure cuffs, & otoscopes, Drug store items: bath towel, wash cloths, bath size soap, toothbrushes, comb, deodorant, band-aids, shampoo, sanitary products for women, diapers for adults.

School Supplies: backpacks, <u>new coloring books</u>, crayons, new pens and pencils, spiral notebooks, construction paper, ruler, glue sticks, blunt scissors, washable markers, protractor, loose leaf paper & notebooks, sports equipment such as soccer balls.

Kitchen supplies: pots & pans, plates, glasses, etc., knives, forks & spoons. **Clothing (gently used or new):** adult, children's clothing, children's shoes, clean and wearable, <u>new underwear</u> (we do not accept used undergarments as customs officials will levy fines if used underwear is sent in our shipment.)

CHRISTIAN SYMBOL

HARP — This multi-stringed musical instrument is associated with David, who played to soothe King Saul and later wrote many Psalms. The harp also represents praise music in general, as well as all the instruments people use to glorify God (see Psalm 71:22). The idea that angels play harps comes from Revelation 14:2 ("And I heard a voice from heaven like the sound of ... harpists playing on their harps").


