From the Pastor

Welcome to February! Not often does Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday coincide, and many probably don't connect the imposition of ashes on their forehead and a reminder of their mortality as a highly romantic gesture. As followers of Christ, it points us to the most audacious act of love we could ever imagine. The greatest Valentine one could ever give or receive. As we hear the words recited, "From dust, you came to dust, you shall return," we are reminded

of how God created us in His own image, but also the reality of the cost of the Fall. It is a reminder of the sin that is now born within us, which needs redemption. We all are destined to die, but in Christ, our death is not eternal. We will not die separated from the glory of God because of what was done for us on the Cross.

Some people find it difficult to focus on sin and our need for redemption, but, for me, it is a grand reminder of just how much has been given to me. It is a reminder of the great love that God has for me, even when I know I have messed up and not done what was right in His eyes. I am reminded that even though I do not measure up, God covers my iniquities and makes me whole. This is the truth for all who believe and trust in Him.

Though it may not be tied to the modern imagery of little cherubs with arrows and the exchange of lovely letters and notes expressing loving verse and words to those whom our hearts desire, I find the words that Christ spoke on the Cross to be the most lovely, "It is finished." Those words speak to

an end to the fear that any who believe carry into the future and remove the wonder of whether we have done enough or not in order to curry the favor of God's heart. Our Lord's heart has been fully revealed.

As we enter into Lent as a time

for reflection, we are given an opportunity to let go of everything that is binding us down and feel the great release that comes in our Lord as He made that journey to the Cross. We can be reminded of the words of the Preacher in

Ecclesiastes 12:7, "and the dust returns to the earth as it was, and the spirit returns to God who gave it." It is God, the Holy Spirit, who fills us and renews us, and, in the end, those who are His are returned to Him. We are not the ones who choose this, but the One who loves us and has claimed us calls His own to Himself.

We cannot choose love any more than we can choose God. When I speak of love, I speak not of the love that we often call love in the world, which one day is here, and the next day has gone with the passing of emotion and passion. The love of God is an abiding love that enraptures the heart and is unending. With it comes the greatest joy and most pointed of pain. The love of our Lord is a love that sacrificed Himself so that we could be His for eternity. A love that chose those who rejected Him when faced with difficulty. The love that accepted you and me. 



CROSS OF ASHES — On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of mourning and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day,

carrying the cross of Christ into the world. Reciting Genesis 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return."
